LARGE ANIMAL PROGRAM

Speaker: Dr. Nicholas Cassotis

Nicholas Cassotis, DVM, DACVO is a graduate of Michigan State University's College of Veterinary Medicine. He concentrated in equine medicine and surgery as well as ophthalmology. He completed a small animal internship at North Carolina State University. Lastly, he returned to his alma mater for his residency in Comparative Ophthalmology. Dr. Cassotis is board certified in Veterinary Ophthalmology. He has practiced ophthalmology in his home state of NH since his residency. He developed the ophthalmology service at Dover Veterinary Hospital over six years. Since the dissolution of DVH's small animal referral practice he has been employed by Port City Veterinary Referral Hospital in Portsmouth, NH. One constant though has been his consulting relationship with New England Equine Medical and Surgical Center since their inception. He dedicates every Friday to equine referral cases at NEEMSC and is available there for after hours emergencies every day.

SMALL ANIMAL PROGRAM

Speaker: Dr. Richard Goldstein

Richard Goldstein graduated from the Koret School of Veterinary Medicine. The Hebrew University of Jerusalem, Israel in 1993. He completed an internship at the same institution and a residency in Small Animal Internal Medicine at the University of California, Davis, in 1998. Goldstein spent two years in a private specialty practice in Southern California and one year as a faculty member at the Koret School in Israel, before joining the faculty at Cornell in September of 2001. He is currently an Associate Professor of Small Animal Internal Medicine at Cornell and is board certified in Small Animal Internal Medicine by the American and European Colleges of Veterinary Internal Medicine. His clinical and research interests are centered around small animal nephrology. Much of his research focuses on infectious diseases and the canine kidney: Specifically Leptospirosis, Lyme Disease and Lyme Nephritis, as well as on canine and feline genomics.
